This craft school was located in a farming community on Öland, an island in the Baltic Sea off the southeast coast of Sweden. It was founded and directed by Karl Malmsten, a well known Swedish furniture designer. The school emphasized traditional Swedish crafts. The clay experience there followed the slip decorated earthenware tradition of pottery that was part of 18th century Swedish culture. In form and decoration it strongly resembles our Pennsylvania Dutch and early Moravian pottery.

Professional Experience:

Clay Work:

1967. After finishing my work at Capellagården, I stayed in Sweden for another four months as a production thrower for a small shop in Gamla Linköping. Gamla Linkoping is a village made of many historical buildings assembled in a living history open-air museum. Here I did mostly throwing, with some finishing on complicated pieces. I reproduced designs as well as created new ones. We worked primarily in earthenware using slip and oxide decoration under clear glazes.

Since 1971. I have established my own studio here in Ann Arbor. I support myself primarily through sales in summer art shows, corporate commissions and sales to and through galleries.

In my studio work my goals are twofold. First to produce a well designed collection of functional pots, and secondly to create challenging one-of-a-kind pieces that will reinvigorate my production line.
